
# PMSOL

The Priority Migration Skilled Occupation List (PMSOL) contains 44 occupations and aims to support Australia's economic recovery from COVID-19 by allowing small numbers of sponsored skilled workers to return to Australia to fill urgent skills needs in critical sectors.



Applications with an occupation on the PMSOL list are given priority processing under the following visa subclasses:

- Temporary Skill Shortage (TSS) visa (subclass 482)
- Skilled Employer-Sponsored Regional (Provisional) visa (subclass 494)
- Employer Nomination Scheme (ENS) visa (subclass 186)
- Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme (RSMS) visa (subclass 187)



Offshore visa holders, who have been sponsored by an eligible Australian business in any of the PMSOL occupations will be able to request for an exemption from current Australia's travel restrictions. Once the exemption is granted, these visa holders will be subjected to a strict 14- day quarantine upon arrival, at their own expense.

The PMSOL is a temporary list and its occupations are subject to change as Australia recovers from COVID-19.

- On 27 July 2021, Pharmacist's occupations (ANZSCO 251511, 251512 and 251513) were added to the PMSOL.
- On 22 June 2021, 22 occupations were added to the PMSOL.
- On 11 May 2021, 234711: Veterinarian was added to the PMSOL.
- On 27 November 2020, 272511: Social Worker was added to the PMSOL.

## WHAT IS A GSM VISA?



Australian General Skilled Migration (GSM) visas are designed for the purpose of targeting and addressing genuine skills shortages in Australia. The intention of the GSM program is to usher in highly employable skilled professionals for provisional or permanent residency in Australia. GSM is the most commonly used form of migration to Australia.

According to the new framework for the eligibility assessment that was introduced in July 2018, a candidate must acquire a benchmark minimum of 65 points in order to qualify. The 65-point benchmark calculation is comprised of a breakdown of various categories such as;

- Age
- Qualification
- Skills and Work Experience
- English Language Testing Results (i.e. IELTS, PTE, TOEFL, OET or CAE)
- Partner English language and Skills

There are three separate pathways that can be utilized for Skilled Migration to Australia, which can also be undertaken parallelly:

- Independent (Subclass 189)
- State Sponsored (Subclass 190)
- Skilled Work Regional Provisional Visa (Subclass 491)

# AUSTRALIAN BUSINESS VISA

A business visa in Australia is for individuals who want to start a business or invest in Australia. This visa category is designed to encourage applicants who possess skills, that will enhance the Australian economy. The rationale for this visa category is to:

- Develop links with international markets;
- Facilitate the creation or maintenance of employment in Australia;
- Increase the export of Australian goods and services;
- Increase the manufacture of goods or provision of services in Australia which would otherwise need to be imported;
- Introduce new technology;
- Increase commercial activity and competitiveness.

Those who apply for and are granted business visas are involved in a two-step process (Subclass 188 & Subclass 888). The process starts with the granting of a provisional visa, which is followed by a permanent visa if the applicant meets ongoing obligations. This process applies to all business visa applicants except for applicants for the Subclass 132 Business Talent visa, who will be granted permanent residence directly upon approval. As you would expect, the criteria for this visa are significantly more stringent than for the provisional visas.

People who may be eligible for a Business Skills visa include:

- Successful business people who own or part-own a business or businesses;
- Successful business people or investors who would prefer to invest substantial sums into Government-backed funds for fixed period of four years;
- Certain business people who have established successful businesses while in Australia and are the holders of qualifying visas.

For all business visa applications, it is a requirement for the applicant to submit a detailed business proposal and demonstrate that they have sufficient assets to settle in Australia.

## BUSINESS VISA CRITERIA

- Be under the age of 55.
- Own at least 30% of the nominated business.
- Annual Turnover at least USD \$ 562,483 for 2 years within the last 4 years.(Annual Turnover in AUD\$ – 750,000)
- Combined Assets (wife, children) at least USD \$ 937,600(Combined Assets in AUD\$ – 1,250,000)
