AUSTRALIA - INDIA TRADE AGREEMENT TO COMMENCE

The Australia - India Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (AIECTA) will commence from **29 December 2022** following both countries completing their domestic arrangements to bring the agreement into operation.

The AIECTA will provide:

- 1000 x Subclass 462 (first) Work and Holiday Program visas for 18-31 year old Indians per year
- Indian students graduating with **First Class Honours bachelor degrees** in STEM fields (including ICT) will be eligible for an extra year on post study visas (three years total).



TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF NEW ZEALAND STREAM - SUBCLASS 189

The New Zealand stream has been temporarily closed to new applications and the regulations have been amended to enable the streamlined processing of the on-hand caseload. The temporary closure means an application cannot be made from 10 December 2022 until 1 July 2023. This is a temporary pause on new applications while the Government considers future migration and citizenship pathways for New Zealand citizens in Australia, reflecting the close ties our two nations have. The following streamlining measures have been designed to acknowledge that this group of New Zealand citizens are long-term residents of Australia who have been working here and contributing to Australia's economic recovery during the COVID-19 pandemic. This means that the primary applicants for the New Zealand stream are no longer required to satisfy the following requirements.

- Be resident in Australia for a continuous period of at least 5 years immediately prior to the date of application, and that residence began prior to 19 February 2016; and
- Meet the taxable income threshold in relation to three income years within five years immediately before the date of application (including the income year that ended most recently before the date of application), or be exempt, for example due to care of a child who is to remain in Australia; and
- Satisfy Public Interest Criterion (PIC) 4007 relating to health

Family members of the primary applicant included in the visa application will also no longer need to satisfy Public Interest Criterion (PIC) 4007 relating to health.



HOLIDAY CLOSURE FOR SKILLS ASSESSING AUTHORITIES



Australia Computing Society

The ACS Skills office will be closed from Friday 23rd December 2022 to Monday January 16 2023.

Engineers Australia

Engineers Australia will be closed from 26 December 2022 to 6 January 2023 inclusive. Assessment applications lodged between 5 December 2022 and 31 January 2023 may experience a service delay, including Fast Track applications.



Trades Recognition Australia

Trades Recognition Australia will be closed for the Christmas and New Year Period.

Job Ready Program: TRA has announced they are experiencing a high number of applications. As a result, the average processing times are longer than expected.

Vetassess

You will still be able to lodge online Skills Assessment applications during the shutdown period but as their customer contact centre will be closed, payments will be processed when their offices reopen.

NSW



NSW Immigration **eased the nomination criteria** for Subclass 190 and Subclass 491 Pathway 1 (Stream A) and Pathway 2 by removing previously published requirements for minimum points scores and work experience

Only candidates applying for **Subclass 491 under the Pathway 1 (Stream B)** will be required to meet the minimum point scores and years of skilled work experience outlined for the relevant ANZSCO unit group on the Stream B skills list.

From 12 December, anyone seeking Tasmanian nomination for a subclass 190 Skilled Nominated or a subclass 491 Skilled Work Regional visa must now first register in the new **Migration Tasmania Application Gateway**.

AUSTRALIA CONDUCTED BIGGEST SKILLSELECT INVITATION ROUND EVER

The Department has issued the largest number of Skillselect invitation round ever on 08th December 2022 inviting massive 35,120 candidates to apply for Skilled Independent Visa Subclass 189 and Subclass 491 visas. This includes Accountant, Chef, Electrician, Computer Network and Systems Engineer, Internal/External Auditor, Fitter, Motor Mechanic (General), Plumber, Software Engineer....etc.....

The table below shows the number of invitations issued in the SkillSelect invitation round on 8 December 2022.

Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa	120



CANADA TO TARGET OCCUPATIONS IN EXPRESS ENTRY DRAWS STARTING IN 2023

Beginning in 2023, Immigration, Refugees, and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) will use new authorities to hold Express Entry draws in which candidates will

be invited based on specific attributes rather than their overall CRS score.

Bill C-19, which was approved by both chambers of government on June 23 and obtained Royal Assent, made it feasible for the anticipated modifications to Express Entry. The Bill gives the immigration minister the power to extend invitations to applicants who possess any desirable skills or qualifications.

Who will be invited?

The recipients of invitations to apply (ITAs) in targeted draws have not yet been confirmed. In order to determine which candidates to target, the minister declared that he would speak with the provinces, business councils, and other stakeholders.



BRITISH COLUMBIA HOLDS LATEST PROVINCIAL NOMINATION DRAWS AS PNPS SLOW

The British Columbia Provincial Nominee Program (BCPNP) held both a general and targeted draw on November 28th.

The province sent out at least 75 invitations to apply (ITAs) to selected professions and 253 ITAs to general candidates. All provinces hold their own, with the exception of Quebec and Nunavut.



Provincial Nominee Programs (PNPs), a method of economic immigration that allows provincial governments to select foreign professionals to settle in their area and fill skills shortages.

The PNP has significantly augmented Canada's immigration policies and is anticipated to displace Express Entry-managed programs as the primary route for economic immigration for foreign workers into Canada by 2024.
